Guest Speaker 50 Year Affiliation Class **Greg Schmitz graduated from West Point in 1976.** He served in the Army Corps of Engineers on active duty for six years with assignments as a platoon leader, a company executive officer, and a company commander. He served an additional 17 years in the Army Reserve. His first reserve assignment was at the Military Ocean Terminal in Bayonne, NJ where he was called to active duty and was the Deputy Installation Commander during Operation Desert Shield. He also served in the Corps of Engineers District Office in New York City, and on a classified top-secret project based in Huntsville, Alabama. He retired as a Lieutenant Colonel with 23 years total service.

As a civilian, he worked in operations at Texas Instruments, Chorum Technologies, a telecom startup, Brilliant Technologies, a small engineering firm, and OsteoMed, a medical implant manufacturer.

He and his wife, Barbara, live in Dallas and have been married 46 years, have two daughters, two sons-in-law, and four grandchildren.



West Point Association of Graduates (AOG)



Preparation

- Push-ups, pull-ups, running, road marching
- Break in boots & running shoes...ruck / run
- Break in low Quarters...house / mall
- Better socks, insoles and underwear
- The packing list & the bag large Ziploc bags
- Wear black socks and low quarters on R-Day
- Bring your mobile phone and a charger








Make sure your boots say that they are **AR** 670-1 Compliant.

AR stands for "Army Regulation." 670-1 is the Army's book that defines uniform requirements. 14

This model number of Bates Lites Black Leather low quarters are recommended.

New Cadets must have leather shoes (not the shiny plastic finish, it must be real leather). Don't worry, West Point will teach you how to make these leather shoes shine!





Send

A multi-tool will make your life easier. If you are flying to West Point, be sure to check airline regulations to be sure you can bring it on the plane. *Knives typically can be packed in your checked luggage, but not carried on.*

If you are staying in a hotel before R-Day, consider mailing it to the hotel and asking for it at the front desk when you arrive.








DRESS LIGHTWEIGHT CREW

> Fox River Socks are excellent. 10 pair each of white ankle socks, black dress socks, and boot socks are recommended.



WICK DRY MAXIMUM MEDIUM WEIGHT MID-CALF BOOT Consider compression shorts / underwear. Look for synthetic fabrics because cotton will not hold up well in the humidity of a West Point summer.


Bank Accounts

- Scholarships -> see the club website for info on using scholarship money, education IRA and 529 plan money
- USMA Treasurers Account -> West Point will have you deposit \$2,000 before you start. This is optional, but if you don't, the Army will send you a smaller paycheck for several months.
- Get a checking account so the Army can deposit your paycheck. A credit card in the cadet's name is also recommended. USAA or bank of your choice.
- USAA and Pentagon Federal Credit Union will be on site during R-Day if you don't have a bank account.

Thoughts on Saying Goodbye

Talk with your cadet and decide which option is best for <u>them</u>. Some kids want to get the emotions over with privately. Others want their family to be with them to the last second.

<u>Saying Goodbye</u> <u>at West Point</u>



Parents had 60 seconds to say goodbye to their new cadets during a quick briefing Monday at Eisenhower Hall. By the end of the day, the new cadets paraded in front of their loved ones and took the oath of office.




New cadets come through Thayer Hall after receiving clothing and other items like duffle bags Monday during Reception Day, or R-Day, a day most cadets remember for a lifetime.

- Pros:
 - West Point is a beautiful place, and you can tour the grounds and scout the surrounding towns for future visits
 - R-Day has many activities that day including the "goodbye" briefing, and the opportunity to see the R-Day parade in the afternoon. For more info see the R-Day experience described in the West Point Mom's book
 - You'll get to buy some great swag at the gift shops and pop-up tables
 - You may get a glimpse of your cadet as they are issued equipment, learn to march, and make their way to their new cadet company area

• Cons:

- Can be expensive for large families
- Expect to be up early cadets report in groups starting as early as 6 am
- The 60 (or 90) second goodbye happens very fast. You will likely not be able to pick out your cadet during the day or spot them at the parade.
- West Point is not visitor friendly limited parking, long walks, few places to eat, it can be very hot, and the long day can be tough on little kids
- You may get emotional during the goodbye. Can your cadet handle that just before they head out for a very stressful 1st day?
- You may have to have the uncomfortable conversation about bringing along, and possibly paying for, a boy-friend / girl-friend to attend

<u>Saying Goodbye</u> <u>At home</u>



• Pros:

- More people can be involved you can make it into a special event with family & friends
- West Point will bus the cadets in from the airport no stress about missing their report time!
- Cadet candidates can get their emotions under control, so they start R-Day ready
- Cost-effective for larger families, especially since you will see very little of your cadet the first day and may not be able to spot them at the parade
- A lot less hassle when trying to beat the crowds and the lack of parking at West Point
- Listen to what West Point publishes for your R-Day. The class of 2024 parents could only drop the kids off and did not get the "typical" R-Day experience described in the West Point Mom's book. With COVID we need to be flexible.
- Your cadet will be reimbursed for a hotel stay and plane ticket bring the receipts to R-Day!

• Cons:

- You may feel like you are "missing" the West Point experience (don't worry, you can spend a lot more time with them on A-Day weekend at the end of the summer!)
- You may wonder how your kid will make it to West Point by themselves (don't worry, they figure it out and likely meet others along the way)







Tips for Staying in Touch

- Take your Cadet out (can use a pass). They will have to stay in the barracks at night.







Plebe Parent Weekend March 2023


- Friday-Sunday before Spring Break

- 2026 Cadets can leave Sunday morning to enjoy Spring Break


